A Unspent DelDOT Municipal Street Aid (MSA) funds from a given fiscal year carryover as reserve in the Village's MSA account. Roadway and pavement projects often require sums much greater than the State's annual allottment. The MSA funds received continue on a downward trend and maintenance is getting more expensive. This budget presents the MSA available in reserve in the Income & Carryover section in order to monitor whether or not our accumulated funds may be great enough to invest in planned maintenance needs, and/or whether outside funding should be pursued, such as Community Transportation Funds (CTF) via our state legislators.
